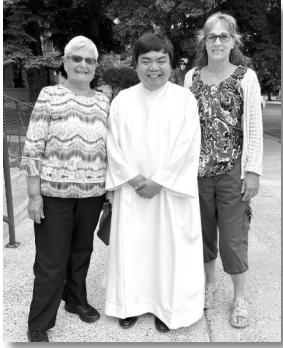


Today's Gospel answers the questions: What can we do to make **sure people we love will believe?** How does faith take root and grow in people?
