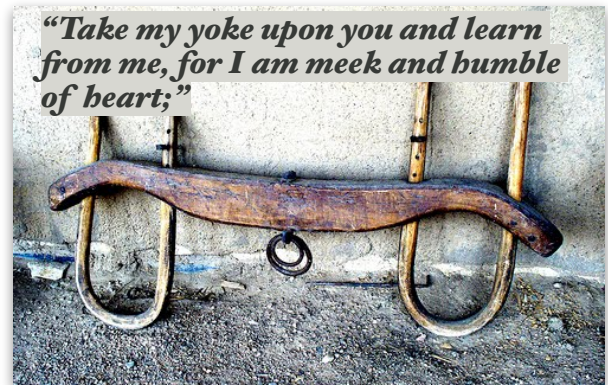

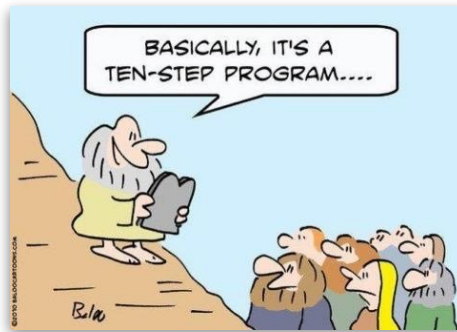

The Eucharistic Miracle of Augsburg



The Eucharistic miracle of Augsburg, is known locally as – “**The Miraculous Good**”. It is described in numerous books and historical documents that can be consulted in the civic state library of Augsburg.

In 1194, a woman from Augsburg who was particularly devoted to the Most Holy Sacrament, received Holy communion. After communion, without being noticed, she put the Host in a handkerchief, **took the Blessed Sacrament home** and placed the Eucharistic Species in a container of wax inside a cupboard.

Five years passed and on the 11th of May 1199, the woman, **tormented by remorse**, confessed to the superior of the convent of the Heilig Kreuz, Father Berthold, who had her bring the Host back. The priest opened up the wax covering that enclosed the Host and saw that the **Holy Eucharist had been transformed into bleeding Flesh**. The Host appeared “divided into two Parts connected together by the thin threads of the bleeding Flesh.” Today the Convent of the Heilig Kreuz (Holy Cross) is taken care of by the Dominican Fathers.

The Importance of Eucharistic Adoration

*The importance of Eucharistic Adoration is shown in the fact that the Church has a ritual that regulates it: the Rite of Eucharistic Exposition and Benediction. This is an extension of the adoration of the Blessed Sacrament which occurs in every Mass: "Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb." Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament flows from the sacrifice of the Mass and serves to **deepen our hunger for Communion with Christ and the rest of the Church**. The Rite concludes with the ordained minister blessing the faithful with the Blessed Sacrament.*

Holy Hours

*Holy hours are the Roman Catholic devotional tradition of spending an **hour in Eucharistic Adoration** in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. The bishops have created a variety of holy hours that focus our prayer to Jesus Christ on peace, life, vocations, and other topics that are at the heart of the life of the Church and the world.
