Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The seventy-two disciples Jesus sent out were more than just missionaries; **they were exorcists.** Christ gave them power over demons, devils, evil spirits, fallen angels—in other words, SATAN.

Satan is pleased by two errors: obsessive interest in him and the denial of his existence. There are three ways the devil can get at us: **possession**, **oppression and temptation**.

Possession is very rare. It freezes the will so that the human person is no longer responsible for the words or acts that the devil is making him do.

Oppression is where the evil spirit does not have **control** of the will but of the **imagination and feelings**. The Church is suspicious of excuses like "the devil made me do it." Eve gave that excuse in the Garden and God did not accept it!

Temptation almost always begins with thought. It is much easier to deal with temptations when they are in their small beginnings. The devil is a very cleaver advertiser. **We need sales resistance.**-Peter Kreeft in Food for the Soul
