

# Parish Finance Council - New Member Needed from Holy Family


After **12 years of service, Larry Biggs** has decided to retire from our Finance Council. The Council **thanks Larry** for his service and many contributions!

**The Parish Finance Council** functions as a consultative body to the pastor. It consists of selected professionals to advise the pastor in these areas:

- 1. Preparation of the annual operating budget
- 2. Long-term financial planning
- 3. Annual parish financial report, which is submitted to the Diocesan Bishop
- 4. Annual and periodic financial reports to the faithful

The Council ensures that an adequate system of internal controls is in place to guide the parish in caring for and managing financial resources and temporal goods. The Parish Finance Council observes all policies and procedures outlined in the Parish Financial Management Handbook which can be found on the Diocese of Sacramento website, under the Offices tab, Finance.


