

THE EUCHARISTIC MIRACLE OF FIECHT

In the miracle of *Fiecht, Austria in 1310* during the Mass, the priest was *seized with doubt* regarding the *Real Presence of Jesus in the species of wine.* Right after the consecration, the *wine changed into Blood and began to boil and overflow the chalice.* The

priest, terrified, was unable to drink all the Holy Blood, and so the abbot placed the remainder in a vessel in the tabernacle of the main altar near the cloth with which the chalice was wiped.

In 1480, after 170 years, the Sacred Blood was "still fresh as though coming out of a wound," wrote the chronicler of those days. The Precious Blood is preserved intact to this day and is contained in the reliquary in the Monastery of St. Georgenberg. ~www.http://www.miracolieucaristici.org
