





Twenty-Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

I (Peter Kreeft) learned in a college theology course that there are many different theories about who Jesus was. Three of the most popular are:

(1) that He was a John the Baptist figure, a forerunner of an even greater prophet to come. The greater prophet is Muhammad, according to Muslims, or the "Maitreia", according to some new cults, or the Rev. Moon, according to the Unification Church (the "Moonies").

(2) Hindus and Buddhists often say Jesus was a reincarnation of some previous great prophet, like Moses or Elijah.

(3) And humanists and modernist theologians say He was just one of the prophets, a good man but not divine. *The same old heresies are available in every age.* So is the simple truth.

Most modern psychology teaches you how to save yourself and lose your sold. **Jesus teaches you how to lose yourself and save your soul.** "If any man would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me.

Notice of Deadline for Filing Claims: October 1, 2024

YOU MAY HAVEA SEXUAL ABUSE CLAIM OR OTHER CLAIM AGAINST THE DIOCESE OF SACRAMENTO

On April 1, 2024, The Roman Catholic Bishop of Sacramento aka Diocese of Sacramento filed a chapter 11 bankruptcy petition for protection under title 11 of the United Stated Code.

If you were sexually abused by any person connected with the Diocese, you must file a claim so as to be received by October1, 2024, or otherwise you will be forever barred, estopped, and enjoined from asserting such claim against the Diocese.

Claims based on acts or omissions of the Diocese that occurred before April 1, 2024, must be filed on or before October 1, 2024, even is such claims are not now fixed, liquidated, or certain or did not mature or become fixed, liquidated, or certain before April 1, 2024.



Myth #3 - Catholics Believe Everything The Pope Says

- 1. The doctrine in question here is that of **papal infallibility**. This means that the pope cannot speak in error when definitively teaching on matters of faith and morals.
- 2. Infallibility also applies to the teaching body of the Church, that is, the *Magisterium*—a word which comes from the Latin for "teacher" and refers to the pope and all the bishops in union with him in their official teaching capacity.
- 3. Infallibility applies only to matters of faith and morals, and only when the pope and/or Magisterium are officially teaching the entire Church about these things, and intend to speak infallibly.
- 4. An *ex cathedra* ("from the chair") statement is one kind of infallible statement, but **not the only kind**. It usually comes in the form of an official declaration on dogma. The last one happened in 1950, when Pope Pius XII declared the doctrine of Our Lady's Assumption *ex cathedra* in the encyclical *Munificentissimus Deus*.
- 5. Based on all this, it is clear that things that the pope says that fall outside these parameters are not infallible and faithful Catholics are not required to believe, support, or agree with them.
