


On the Lighter Side

Faith vs. Fiction - Myths About The Catholic Faith Series

Myth #3 - Catholics Worship Bread

- 1. Catholics don't worship bread. We worship Christ, Who is really present in the Eucharist.
- 2. At Mass, through the power of the Holy Spirit working through the priest, **the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ.** It is not a symbol. It is not merely **like** His Body and Blood. It is not merely His spiritual presence within bread and wine. It is Christ Himself.
- 3. We believe that Our Lord is truly present in the Eucharist **because that is what He told us to believe.**
- 4. **Belief in the Eucharist is scriptural.** It is established and foreshadowed in the Old Testament and made explicit in the New Testament.

Notice of Deadline for Filing Claims: October 1, 2024

YOU MAY HAVEA SEXUAL ABUSE CLAIM OR OTHER CLAIM AGAINST THE DIOCESE OF SACRAMENTO

On April 1, 2024, The Roman Catholic Bishop of Sacramento aka Diocese of Sacramento filed a chapter 11 bankruptcy petition for protection under title 11 of the United Stated Code.

If you were sexually abused by any person connected with the Diocese, you must file a claim so as to be received by October1, 2024, or otherwise you will be forever barred, estopped, and enjoined from asserting such claim against the Diocese.

Claims based on acts or omissions of the Diocese that occurred before April 1, 2024, must be filed on or before October 1, 2024, even is such claims are not now fixed, liquidated, or certain or did not mature or become fixed, liquidated, or certain before April 1, 2024.
