Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today’s Gospel has some very strong images in it. If one has good health, good eyes, good feet, etc. but does not use them for the good of others, Jesus says **to get rid of that which causes one to sin**. His description of “hell” is not beautiful. This Gospel teaches: “One who neglects his soul to care for his body is like one who dies in a fire trying to save his

clothes.” **Selfishness and pride are a corrosion** that will “devour your flesh like a fire.” That is why the Lord calls for such aggressive efforts to root out sin and focus on God.

Today’s Psalm 19 reminds us that **“The law of the Lord is perfect, refreshing the soul; the decree of the Lord is trustworthy, giving wisdom to the simple.”**

Unity On The Essentials

Jesus criticizes the **exclusive mentality** of his disciples. He opens their eyes to an apostolate of wide-ranging dimensions. Christians should **not have a ‘one-party’** mentality which would lead them to **reject legitimate diversity** in apostolic activities. **All that matters is unity in the essentials**, in that which forms the **foundations of the Church**.

Every Christian has a part to play in the Church’s apostolic work. The Lord wants there to be apostles in the **factory, the office, the university, in the home** ... As a consequence of their faith, Christians should live a filial **unity with the Pope and the Bishops**.

If we are **full-time Christians**, then we will have to **take our faith into the workplace**. We will want to light up our conduct by becoming familiar with the **social doctrine of the Church**.

Faith vs. Fiction - Myths About The Catholic Faith Series

Myth #4 - Catholics Added Books To The Bible

- 1. The Council of Rome in 382 A.D. defined the canon of Scripture. The council promulgated the 73 books that we use as the Bible today. Numerous councils throughout the centuries have reaffirmed the canon since then, including the Councils of Hippo and Carthage in the late 4th century.
2. The Apostles and the other New Testament writers used the Septuagint—the 46-book Greek translation of the Old Testament that includes the 7 originally-Greek books contested by Protestants.
3. The Bible came from the Catholic Church. For more than a millennium after the Council of Rome, the 73-book canon of the Bible was universally accepted among Christian believers.
4. It was the Protestant Revolt that began the debate in the Christian community about what books ought to make up the Old Testament.

Notice of Deadline for Filing Claims: October 1, 2024

YOU MAY HAVE A SEXUAL ABUSE CLAIM OR OTHER CLAIM AGAINST THE DIOCESE OF SACRAMENTO

On April 1, 2024, The Roman Catholic Bishop of Sacramento aka Diocese of Sacramento filed a chapter 11 bankruptcy petition for protection under title 11 of the United States Code.

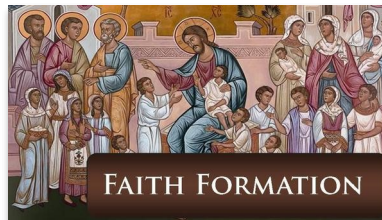
If you were sexually abused by any person connected with the Diocese, you must file a claim so as to be received by October 1, 2024, or otherwise you will be forever barred, estopped, and enjoined from asserting such claim against the Diocese.

Claims based on acts or omissions of the Diocese that occurred before April 1, 2024, must be filed on or before October 1, 2024, even if such claims are not now fixed, liquidated, or certain or did not mature or become fixed, liquidated, or certain before April 1, 2024.
