

# Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's Gospel has one unusual feature: **Jesus gives one of the characters a name.** (He is the only parable character upon whom Jesus bestows name.)





[by men], but God kept quiet about it. The other's name was lost in silence, and God spoke it. Please do not be surprised. **God just read out what was written in his book**. . . God who lives in heaven kept quiet about the rich man's name because he **did not find it written in heaven**. He spoke the poor man's name because **he found it written there**, indeed he gave instructions for it be written there."

By naming the one but not the other, Jesus lays out his theme from the outset: **the goal of human life is** not worldly prosperity, which always proves transient; rather, it **is to find one's name written in God's book** - in other words, to attain everlasting happiness in heaven.
