Faith vs. Fiction - Myths About The Catholic Faith Series

Myth #5 - Catholics Are Obsessed With Sin

- 1. The accusation that the Church is "obsessed with sin," is essentially an **objection to her rules**. But we can see in other areas of life that **anything of importance has rules**. For example, the road has rules, including "negative" rules such as bans on speeding, running stop signs, and driving on the wrong side of the road. These rules are designed to prevent injury and death and to help drivers effectively reach their destinations. Other laws are likewise necessary for us to thrive and flourish **rather than simply survive**.
- 2. Similarly, the Church's rules are designed to **promote** human happiness and flourishing, on the individual and collective level. She has no arbitrary or unnecessary rules.
- 3. We see in Scripture that **God laid down clear rules for living:** the Ten Commandments formed the core of the Israelites' moral life and continue to do so for us as Christians. Among the many places in the Gospels where we see Christ setting rules for living is Matthew 7:12: "So whatever you wish that men would do to you, do so to them..." and again in His merciful response to the woman caught in adultery: "Neither do I condemn you; go, and do not sin again" (John 8:11).
- 4. The Church and the world agree on many, many rules. Major sins often have corresponding major crimes murder, slavery, theft, and fraud, for example.
- 5. Only in certain areas of life do we see objections to rules, and these areas invariably relate to matters of **personal discipline**, particularly sexual morals.
