The Rosary - 2nd Half of the Hail Mary

Until the 14th century, the Hail Mary consisted of the Angelic Salutation: "Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with you!" and the Evangelic Salutation: "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb!"

The second half of the Hail Mary was not introduced until the latter part of the Middle Ages. Since it seizes upon the two decisive moments of life: "now" and "at the hour of our death," it suggests the spontaneous outcry of people in a great calamity. The Black Death, which ravaged all Europe and wiped out one-third of its population, prompted the faithful to cry out to the Mother of Our Lord to protect them at a time when the present moment and death were almost one. "Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners now and at the hour of our death."

It wasn't until the $16^{\rm th}$ century when the prayers of the Hail Mary were officially codified by the Church that the $2^{\rm nd}$ half of the Hail Mary became the norm.

THE EUCHARISTIC MIRACLES OF BUENOS AIRES



In the miracles of **Buenos**Aires, Argentina in 1992, 1994
and 1996 consecrated Hosts
transformed into Blood.

In 1992, after the Mass of Friday May 1, while preparing the Eucharistic reserve, a Eucharistic minister found some pieces of consecrated Host on the corporal. Following what the Church prescribes to do in these situations, the priest had them put in a vessel of water, which was then placed in the tabernacle to wait for them to dissolve. May 8, they opened the tabernacle and saw that

the Host fragments had become a reddish color that looked like blood. The following Sunday, May 10, during the two evening Masses, several small drops of blood were noticed on the patens with which the priests distributed Communion.

On Sunday, July 24, 1994, during the children's Mass, while the Eucharistic minister took the pix from the tabernacle, **he saw a drop of blood running along its side.**

On August 15, 1996, during the Mass of the Assumption of the Most Holy Virgin, a consecrated Host, which fell to the ground during the distribution of Communion, had to be placed again in a vessel of water so it would dissolve. A few day s later, on August 26, a Eucharistic minister opened the tabernacle and saw that Host had transformed into Blood.

The Relic of the Miracles is still preserved today at the Church of Saint Mary.


The Saints & The Eucharist

How to Stay Focused While Praying the Rosary

- Put yourself in the **presence of God** and imagine that God and his Blessed Mother are watching you.
- Imagine that your guardian angel is at your right hand, taking your Hail Marys, if they are well said, and using them like roses to make crowns for Jesus and Mary.



- Remember that **at your left hand is the devil,** ready to pounce on every Hail Mary that comes his way and to write it down in his book of death, if they are not said with attention, devotion, and reverence.
- Do not fail to offer up each decade in honor of one of the mysteries, and try to form a picture in your mind of Jesus and Mary in connection with that mystery.
