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PARABLE OF THE PERSISTENT WIDOW



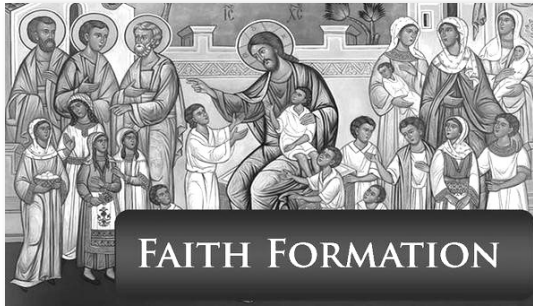
Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's Gospel teaches us the value of **persistence in prayer**. If even wicked men will give us good things if we are persistent enough, will God be less good and less generous than that? Why then does God delay

answering our prayers? He never does. **We do.** We delay in praying, God waits for our prayers. He sees that we need prayer, and the **trust** that motivates prayer, more than we need the things we pray for. 5. Finding Jesus in the Temple—Joy in finding Jesus

Sorrowful Mysteries - Said on Tuesdays and Fridays

1. The Agony in the Garden— Sorrow for sin
2. The Scourging at the Pillar—Purity
3. Crowning with Thorns – Courage
4. Carrying of the Cross— Patience
5. The Crucifixion –Perseverance

Glorious Mysteries - Said on Wednesdays and Sundays

1. The Resurrection—Faith
2. The Ascension— Hope
3. Descent of the Holy Spirit—Love of God
4. The Assumption—Grace of a Happy Death
5. The Coronation—Trust in Mary's Intercession

Luminous Mysteries - Said on Thursdays

1. Baptism of Jesus—Openness to the Holy Spirit
