Second Sunday of Lent

Peter Kreeft, in The Man Who Left His Mark, writes:

In the Holy Land, everywhere you go, there is a building, a church, or a shrine for every event in the Bible. Who invented the idea of responding to holy events by buildings?

St. Peter: "Master, it is well that we are here; Let us make three booths..." A Gothic cathedral is not reasonable. It is a child's awestruck, wordless, "OH", responding to a glimpse of Heaven, when we do not know what to say in words

Another question: Who is the leading expert on Christology, and who does he say Christis?

"And a voice came out of the cloud, 'This is my beloved Son; listen to him." (Mark 9:7)

In the *Miraculous Communion of Saint Clare of Montefalco*, Clare came up to Holy Communion *without her mantle*. Sister Giovanna *rebuked her harshly*, saying to her, 'Go away - I don't want you to receive Holy Communion.' Hearing these words, Clare realized that she was without her mantle and felt such *bitter regret* that after she returned to her cell, she wept bitterly.



And while she was praying, amid her tears, Christ appeared to her, and embracing her, gave her Holy Communion, leaving her deeply consoled.


