




Eucharistic Miracle of Ludbreg

IN THE EUCHARISTIC MIRACLE OF LUDBREG, CROATIA IN 1411, A PRIEST DOUBTED WHETHER THE BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST WERE REALLY PRESENT IN THE EUCHARISTIC SPECIES. IMMEDIATELY AFTER BEING

CONSECRATED, THE WINE TURNED INTO BLOOD. TODAY THE PRECIOUS RELIC OF THE MIRACULOUS BLOOD STILL DRAWS THOUSANDS OF THE FAITHFUL, AND EVERY YEAR AT THE BEGINNING OF SEPTEMBER THE SO-CALLED "SVETA NEDILJA - HOLY SUNDAY" IS CELEBRATED FOR AN ENTIRE WEEK.

IN THE 18TH CENTURY, NORTHERN CROATIA WAS RAVAGED BY THE PLAGUE. THE PEOPLE TURNED TO GOD TO CALL UPON HIS HELP, AND THE CROATIAN PARLIAMENT DID THE SAME. DURING THE SESSION HELD ON DECEMBER 15, 1739 IN THE CITY OF VARAZDIN, THEY VOWED TO BUILD A CHAPEL AT LUDBREG IN HONOR OF THE MIRACLE IF THE PLAGUE ENDED. THE PLAGUE WAS AVERTED, BUT THE PROMISED VOW WAS ONLY FULFILLED IN 1994, WHEN DEMOCRACY WAS RESTORED IN CROATIA.
