Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's Gospel is Jesus' longest discourse about the world's last day and what will happen before it. Jesus' predictions are general, not specific, but they



are the best guide we have to the future.

The hymn How Can I keep from Singing sums up Christ's predictions: "My life flows on in endless song;/Above earth's lamentations" - natural disasters like earthquakes, famine and plagues; "Through all the tumult and the strife" - wars and insurrections; "What though the darkness 'round me close" - the false messiahs who preach the gospel of prosperity and pride and self-esteem; "When tyrants tremble, sick with fear" - persecutions, betrayals, arrests, imprisonments of Christians.

"No storm can shake my inmost calm/While to that rock I'm clinging./Since Love is Lord of heaven and earth,/HOW CAN I KEEP FROM SINGING?




WELCOME TO THE NEWLY BAPTIZED!








THE LITTLE BLUE BOOK
