Meditations on the Our Father (A Weekly Series) "Our Father"

The first words of the Lord's prayer are **Abba**, **Father**. The

early Christians did their best to preserve the Aramaic word which Jesus used: Abba.

This word **sets the tone** for the rest of the prayer. We find ourselves immediately in a **relationship of trust and filiation**.

The Catechism of the Council of Trent teaches that the Lord omitted other words which might have induced awe or fear in us. He wanted to use a word which would inspire love and confidence in those who were praying. What word could be more agreeable than 'father', so full is it of tenderness and affection?

Jesus chose the word Jewish children used to address their fathers. This was the word He found most suitable for invoking the Creator of the entire Universe. Abba! Father!

It is not easy to take this in. The same God who transcends all things is a Father wholly interested in the lives of his children! Even though we are often weak and ungrateful, the Father wants us to spend eternity with him. We have been born so as to attain Heaven.

When we pray the Our Father we should take care to savor those sweet words, Abba, Father, my Father ... This prayer will then have a decisive influence on our daily life because if we really mean that God is our father, we will struggle to behave as his worthy children.

The Eucharistic Miracle of Turin

In the Eucharistic Miracle of Turin, Italy in 1640, During the invasion by Count Harcourt's army, the soldiers entered the Church of St. Maria del Monte and killed many civilians.

The lives of the Capuchin friars, however, were spared. A French soldier succeeded in opening the tabernacle which contained a

ciborium with several consecrated Hosts. Flames of fire miraculously blazed out to envelop him - burning his face and his clothing. The door of the tabernacle which is adorned with agate and lapis lazzuli or blue stones still shows the imprint of the soldier's scorched hand.
