The Lord's Day

After the Resurrection, the first day of the week was commemorated by the Apostles as the Lord's day, dominica dies, (Apoc 1:10) the day on which He had won victory over sin and death for us through His Resurrection.

The Church, following an apostolic tradition which began with the Resurrection of Christ, celebrates the paschal mystery once a week, on the day which is fittingly called the 'day of the Lord' or Sunday. (Second Vatican Council, Sacrosanctum concilium, 106)

We must try through example and apostolate to make Sunday into the Lord's day, a day of adoration and glorification of God, of the Holy Sacrifice, of prayer, of rest, of recollection, of cheerful meetings in the family. (Pope Pius XII, Address, September 7 1947)
