FOURTH CANDLE OF THE ADVENT WREATH

We light the last purple candle - the "Angels' Candle." The angels announced that Jesus came to

bring peace so this candle represents peace.

Tomorrow is **Christmas Day** so, the **center white candle will be lit**. It represents light and purity. It is the **"Christ" candle".**



The 12 Days of Christmas are the days between Christmas and the Epiphany. (This changed when the Church made the Epiphany a Sunday feast.)

Between 1558 until 1829, Roman Catholics were restricted in practicing their faith openly in England. During this time a Christmas Song was written as a catechism for teaching young children the scriptures. Each element in the carol has a code word for a religious reality, which the children could remember.

The partridge in a pear tree was Jesus Christ.

Two turtledoves were the Old Testament & the New Testament.

Three *french hens* stood for *faith, hope, and love*.

Four calling birds were the four gospels: Matthew, Mark, Luke and John.

Five golden rings recalled the Torah or Law, the first five books of the Old Testament.

Six geese a-laying stood for the six days of creation.

I've read other symbolizations: I=God, 3=three persons in God, 7=sacraments, etc. But I think that since this was a Christmas song for children and not many books were available and common people could not read, the very basics were the intended symbol.

Eucharistic MIRACLE OF SILLA



In the Eucharistic miracle of Silla, Spain in 1907 during the celebration of the Mass on March 25, 1907, feast of the Annunciation, Fernando Gomez, pastor of the Church of Our Lady of the Angels in Silla, opened the tabernacle to get the Hosts for the Communion of the faithful. Greatly perturbed, he found the little tabernacle door opened and the precious silver ciborium with all the consecrated Hosts missing. The Sacred Species were found two days later in a small garden outside the city, *hidden under a stone*. The pastor returned them with a solemn procession to the church. In 1934, the Hosts remained "in the same way in which they were found under the stone and they had remained unchanged in the original condition" almost 100 years ago.

Even today it is possible to adore the miraculous **Hosts.** The Hosts are preserved in the church of Our Lady of the Angels in Silla.
