Apparitions of Our Blessed Mother ~ Our Lady of Good Help

The only apparition of Our Lady to take place in the U.S. was in Champion [New Franken], Wisconsin in 1859, and wasn't approved by the Church until **2010.** The visionary was **Adele Brise**, who worked with her family on their farm.

Mary's first apparition was along the road as Adele was on the way to the grist mill with a sack of wheat on her head. Adele stopped, frightened, when she saw the Lady. The vision slowly disappeared leaving a white cloud.

The second apparition happened on the following Sunday, when Adele and her companions were on the way to Mass. Adele saw the vision again and remarked, "Oh, there is that lady again." Her companions did not see the vision, which disappeared as before leaving a little mist or white cloud.

The third apparition was that same day, as Adele was returning home. She saw a beautiful lady clothed in dazzling white, with a yellow



sash. When Adele asked who she was, she replied, "I am the Queen of Heaven, who prays for the conversion of sinners, and I wish you to do the same." When Adele asks Our Lady, "What more can I do? How shall I teach them who know so little myself?" The radiant visitor instructed: "Teach them their catechism, how to sign themselves with the Sign of the Cross, and how to approach the sacraments: that is what I wish you to do. Go and fear nothing. I will help you." Adele forms a community of companions that did this.

Adele told her family about the event, and her father believed her and had a rough chapel constructed to honor the apparition.

The fourth apparition took place three years after the third one. The Peshtigo Fire broke out and burned 400 sq. miles and killed about 1500 people. Adele and her community took the statue of Mary from the chapel and processed, with all the people who had come there for protection, around the perimeter of the land. When the fire was extinguished, it was seen that the fire had destroyed all the land outside the chapel grounds and had stopped abruptly at the fence. It had left undisturbed the five acres of the shrine and all the cattle and farm animals which had been brought there for safety.




