The Baptism of the Lord

Who was Cornelius in the second reading? Cornelius was a **Roman Centurion** who was sent to Peter to ask if he would preach the Gospel to his pagan household. As a strict Jew, **Peter** would be **surprised by the request**, because he thought the teachings of Jesus were for the Jews alone. After a dream, "Peter proceeded to speak to those gathered in the house of Cornelius, saying: 'In truth, I see that God shows no partiality." (How many years before did

Christ show no partiality when welcoming the Magi?)

In the Gospel, **the word "baptize"** in Greek means "drown" or "completely submerge". **It implies death**. That is exactly what one does—dies to the self one got from ones' parents, the self with original sin. In exchange, one gets a new identity from God, a share in supernatural life



Formula for valid baptism

These 3 things must be present

- 1. The correct intention to baptize
- 2. The correct matter water
- 3. The correct form "in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit" (Matt. 28:19).

Who can baptize?

Priests and deacons. Because baptism is ordinarily necessary for salvation, in lifeand-death situations in which a priest or deacon is not available, anyone, including Catholics, non-Catholics, non-Christians, and non-theists, may baptize so long as they do so in the correct formula.

January is Dedicated to the Holy Name of Jesus



Did you know that, according to Catholic tradition, each month of the year carries with it a specific devotion to an aspect of our Faith?

January's devotion is to the Holy Name of Jesus. This gives us a whole month to honor this feast in a special way. January 3rd, specifically, was the Feast of the Holy Name of Jesus.

Isn't it beautiful that our Church gives us a special day (and month!) to meditate on the mystery of God's saving action in our lives through His Son?

Devotion to Jesus' Name is present in Sacred Scripture:

Because of this, God greatly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, **that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend**, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth, **and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord**, to the glory of God the Father. — Philippians 2:6-11 (emphasis added)

Honor Jesus' Holy Name

The Jesus Prayer. The prayer is simple: on each bead of a Rosary pray, "Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner."

The Litany of the Most Holy Name of Jesus: This is a powerful way to meditate on Jesus' name.

Golden Arrow Prayer (An Act of Reparation): May the most holy, most sacred, most adorable, most incomprehensible and unutterable Name of God be always praised, blessed, loved, adored and glorified in Heaven, on earth, and under the earth, by all the creatures of God, and by the Sacred Heart of Our Lord Jesus Christ, in the Most Holy Sacrament of the Altar. Amen.
