Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross

According to legend, Saint Helena, mother of Emperor Constantine the Great, discovered the True Cross while on a pilgrimage to Jerusalem in the year 326. The Church of the Holy



Sepulcher was built by Constantine on the site of discovery. September 14 marks the date of that church's dedication.

Although this feast seems a little out of synch with the liturgical year, it is important not to compartmentalize the great truths of our faith by calendar. The Cross is the iconic symbol of Christianity and the central teaching of Jesus. Good Friday commemorates the Passion and Death of Jesus, but today's feast focuses on the Cross itself. Jesus says we must take up the cross daily.

St. Paul spoke of the Cross as a "stumbling block to the Jew and an absurdity to the Gentiles." It was love that transformed that instrument of torturous death into the way of our salvation.

We are confronted daily with the cross, in whatever form it takes in our personal lives. What gives that across value, is our response to it.
