### Fifth Sunday of Lent

Today's readings remind us that God is not somewhere "up there," but is intimately acquainted with human suffering. Isaiah bids us not to dwell in the past, but to look at the new things that God is doing for His people. In the Psalm and the First Reading, God has us



look not to the past, but to rejoice in the present good and look to the future.

In the Gospel, the mob, concerned with what the adulteress did in the near-past, having judged her, is looking to Jesus for their justification. Jesus, thwarts their efforts by turning the question back onto them. **Christ is concerned not with her past but with her future,** not condemning as did the mob, but loving her and bidding her to live her life free from sin.

### What are Godparents?

Godparents chosen by parents to assist in raising their child in the faith, serving as spiritual guides and witnesses to the child's baptism and throughout their life.

#### Responsibilities:

**Spiritual Guidance:** Godparents are expected to be a positive influence, helping the child grow in their faith and understanding of the Catholic Church.

**Support for Parents:** They assist parents in raising their child in the faith, offering encouragement and support.

Witness to the Faith: Godparents are expected to live their lives as faithful Catholics, serving as an example for their godchild.



#### Requirements:

**Catholic:** Godparents must be practicing Catholics who have received the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist.

**Age:** They must be at least 16 years old.

**Good Standing:** They must be in good standing with the Church, meaning they are not excommunicated or living in a way that contradicts Church teachings.

Not the Child's Parents: They cannot be the child's parents.

### Origins of The Stations of the Cross

Adricomius, in his "Description of Jerusalem," says: "A pious and ancient tradition relates that the Blessed Virgin, who had followed, with those who attended her, the blood-stained footsteps of her Son even to the Cross, **returned to the spot after His entombment**, and, before all others, devoutly made the Way of the Cross; which appears to have originated the processions, and carrying the Cross, among the faithful."

Our Lady revealed to St. Bridget that such had been her practice. "After the Ascension of my Son, I constantly visited the places where He had suffered, and had shown forth His wondrous acts " (Revel. lib. vi. c. 6). (Leo X., 1517)

The Apostles and the Disciples of Jesus, the holy women, and many other daughters of Jerusalem, made it their duty, after the example of Mary, frequently to visit the places sanctified by the blood of our Blessed Redeemer; and, as we learn from history, the Way of the Cross became afterwards the favorite devotion of the faithful.
