Fifth Sunday of Lent

Today's readings all focus on Easter - the Resurrection. From the time of Ezekiel (6th century B.C., Babylonian Exile), God promised that soon the **graves** of the dead would open and they would rise. How? "I will put my spirit in you that you may live."

In Romans, St. Paul writes that God, who raised Jesus from **the dead**, will rise also those in whom the Spirit dwells.

This Gospel passage shows **Jesus as true Man and true God.** John emphasized the Jesus loved Lazarus and his sisters. When Jesus saw Mary weeping and Jews who had come with her weeping, **he wept**. John expresses God's viewpoint on **physical death as sleep**, a sleep from which he can awaken us at any moment—Lazarus was in the tomb for four days! Jesus said, "Did I not tell you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?"

This event will teach us just how far we must go in trusting the power of Jesus' love for us.



Jesus' act of raising Lazarus shows the extent to which the power of God's grace can go, and thus the extent of our conversion, our transformation. Listen carefully: there is no limit to the divine mercy offered to everyone! Remember this sentence. Let us say it together: 'There is no limit to divine mercy which is offered to everyone!' The Lord is always ready to remove the tombstone of our sins, which separate us from Him, the Light of the living. Pope Francis, Angelus, 6 April 2014

Chaplet of St. Joseph

Last Monday we celebrated the Solemnity of St. Joseph, Spouse of Mary. I came across a "NEW" item in a religious catalog "Chaplet of St. Joseph". Sounded interesting, so I sent for one.



This chaplet consists of a medal of St. Joseph followed by 15 groups of one white bead (symbolizing his purity) and three purple beads (his piety).

The **patronage** of this chaplet is for **family protection** and the **grace of a happy death**. My family is in great need of help to return to the practice of the faith.

- On the white beads, pray two Hail Marys and meditate on a mystery of the Rosary. (I like the joyful ones with St. Joseph there.)
- On the purple beads, pray "Praised and blessed by Jesus, Mary and Joseph!"
- At the end: "Pray for us, O holy Saint Joseph, that we may be worth of the promises of Christ.
- Conclude with: "O God, who predestined St. Joseph from all eternity for the service of Your Eternal Son and His Blessed Mother, and made him worthy to be the spouse of the Blessed Virgin and foster father of Your Son; we beseech You through all the services he rendered to Jesus and Mary on earth, that You would make us worthy of his intercession and grant us to enjoy the happiness of his company in heaven. Through Christ our Lord, Amen."

History of the Easter Lily

So, how did the white trumpet lily become the Easter lily? During the 1880s, while in Bermuda, Mrs. Thomas Sargent became enamored of the beautiful white Bermuda trumpet lily. She took its bulbs back to Philadelphia, where it caught on among local florists. Since it blooms in spring, the flower soon became known as the "Easter lily," and its popularity spread. The lily had been introduced to Bermuda from its native Japan and is now grown primarily on North America's Pacific Coast.
