First Sunday of Lent

The first reading from Genesis tells of the first temptation of man by the snake (the devil).

The Psalm asks for God's mercy because **'we humans** tend to fall for the devil'

The Gospel of Matthew tells of the temptations of Christ by the devil.

The **"one righteous act"** that St. Paul speaks about in his letter to the Romans is **Jesus' unfailing fidelity to the Father's will.** As the serpent comes close, we will **not be duped** by the suggestion **that somehow God is jealous** at the prospect that we **"will be like gods."** For God himself planted that hope in our hearts. The Lord's greatest joy and glory is that we share his image and likeness, not through self-seeking but through the obedience by "which many will be made righteous." -*The Magnificat*

Conquering the Tempter

The Lord endures temptation form the devil...for the sake of our salvation...The Lord deems it fitting both to be tempted and to grow hungry...Although there may be different temptations of the devil all around us, in these three temptations the devil uses food, power and pride [basic human failings].

The Lord has shown us **how** us ought **to conquer temptations** of this sort...we should **set forth examples** for ourselves **from the divine law in opposition to the temptation**, so that we would always **desire to be satiated instead by the food of the divine word**....For this is what the Lord answered to the devil when he said, "It is written, not by bread alone does man live, but by every word of God."

Did you know?

A **plenary indulgence** is granted to the faithful who personally make the pious Way of the Cross. The exercise must be made before stations legitimately erected. Manual of Indulgences



Fasting: When fasting we are permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. We fast to practice self-control. **Fasting is obligatory on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday from age 18 to 59.** (See U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops website for more information)

<u>Abstinence</u>: When abstaining, we do not eat meat. <u>Abstinence</u> is obligatory on Fridays during Lent.

- Lent is reminiscent of the 40 Days Christ spent in the desert, so we no longer need any poinsettias in the church.
