Fourth Sunday of Easter

**"I am the Good Shepherd.
A good shepherd lays down his
life for the sheep."**

Does it not seem **odd for a shepherd to lay down his life for his sheep?** After all, sheep are raised and tended for the survival of the shepherd. From the sheep, shepherds got wool for clothing and food for their body. Sheep

were sacrificed at the Temple on Passover for the good of man's soul.

A shepherd, to feed himself and his family, will slaughter and consume a sheep, but in the Eucharist, we the sheep consume our Shepherd who became the Lamb for us. **We are nourished by his flesh and his blood, not he by ours.**

Jesus is the Good Shepherd

Jesus entrusts Peter and his successors with the government of his Church to **continue his mission on earth**. In his last appearance before the Ascension, the risen Christ made Peter **the shepherd of his flock**, the Church's guide.

The Church is built on the **primacy of Peter**, as on a rock, until the end of the world. Peter's stature is immeasurably enhanced since Christ is the Real foundation of the Church.

Love for the Pope goes back to the Church's beginnings. We ought to **pray a lot for the Pope and his intentions**, since he bears the heavy weight of the Church on his shoulders.

And there would be no true love and respect for the Pope **without faithful internal and external obedience** to his teaching and doctrine.

EUCCHARISTIC MIRACLE OF ROME

The **Eucharistic Miracle of Rome, Italy in 595** took place during a Eucharistic celebration presided by **Pope St. Gregory the Great**. At the moment of receiving

Holy Communion, a Roman noblewoman **who baked the bread** for communion, **began to laugh because she had doubts about the Real Presence of Christ** in the consecrated Bread and Wine. The Pope, troubled by her disbelief, decided not to give her Communion **and then the Bread turned into Flesh and Blood**.

The woman **repented, knelt on the ground and began to cry**. To this day, part of the relic of the miracle is housed in Anechs, Germany, near the local Benedictine monastery.
