YEAR OF THE PARISH EUCHARIST REVIVAL

The U. S. Bishops have call for a renewal of our devotion to Christ in the Eucharist by devoting the next year to the Eucharist.

"Eucharist" means "thanksgiving" which means that a **spirit of gratitude** is meant to be at **the center of our lives**. Gratitude dispels all negative thoughts and emotions, for it is impossible to be bitter, cynical or angry and grateful simultaneously.

Devotion cannot be just a matter of feelings, but **must be accompanied by understanding.** As St. Thomas Aquinas said, "You cannot love what you do not know."

A spirit of thanksgiving is meant to permeate every aspect of our lives, knowing that **God is present in** every situation, even **negative ones**, for as our Lord said, "I am with you always." (Matt 20-8:20)


