Why did the Lord come as fiery **tongues on Pentecost?**

Ann Burleigh gives this explanation: Tongues are **essential to** that most distinctively human gift - **language**. In turn language is made up of words, which, if they are true words, signify the Word, that is, the **Son of God himself**.

When men in their pride build the tower to their own glory, the Lord smote them in their singular attribute, language. Once their words became disordered Babel, so did their minds collapse in confusion.

The **tongues of Pentecostal fire: the restoration, the reordering of language** so that the recipients can understand the universal truth of **God's Word - Jesus Christ**.

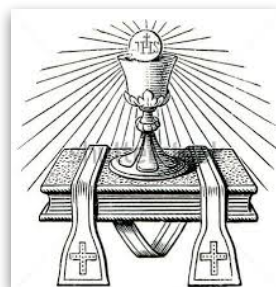

Eucharistic Miracle of Blanot

Easter this year was celebrated on March 31. The Eucharist Miracle of Blanot, France in 1331 **also occurred on Easter Sunday, March 31.**

During Communion, a Host fell to a cloth that was held below the communicant's mouth. The priest tried to pick up the Holy Eucharist, but it was not possible. **The Host had transformed into Blood, resulting in a stain the same size as the Host, on the cloth.** That cloth is preserved today in the village of Blanot.

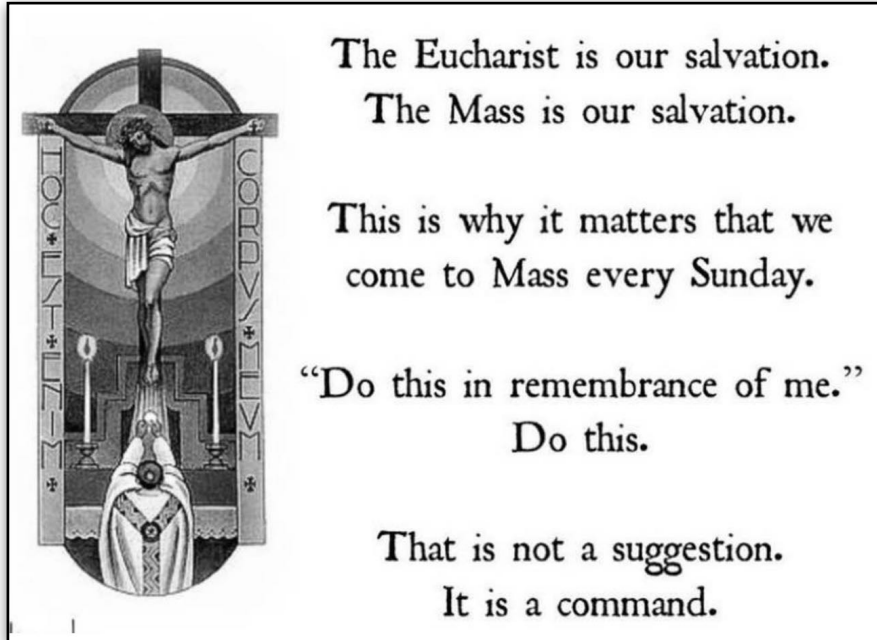


ON THE LIGHTER SIDE
