Second Sunday of Easter -Divine Mercy

"Mercy is heartfelt sympathy for another's distress, impelling us to succor him if we can. - St. Augustine

On this the last day of the Novena of Divine Mercy, the prayer is "bring to Me souls who have become *lukewarm* and immerse them in the abyss of My mercy." I think of the "lukewarm souls" in my life: my children who I raised to practice the Catholic faith, but in the years after leaving home have chosen to neglect this. They remind me of Thomas who would not believe the apostles who said "We have seen the *Lord.*" On this Divine Mercy Sunday, I pray especially for them that Christ may say to them as He did to Thomas: "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe."

The Divine Mercy Message

The message of Divine Mercy and its corresponding devotion come to us through the writings of **St. Maria Faustina Kowalska**, a Polish nun who received apparitions of Our Lord Jesus from **1931 until her death seven years later**. **At Jesus' instruction**, Faustina recorded her visions in her Diary, including the extensive words that Christ spoke to her and, through her, **to the whole world**.

God's merciful love is greater than all sin, greater than all evil and greater than death itself. Mercy is the greatest attribute of God - it is His love poured out on us sinners. No matter what we have done, God wants us to repent and turn to His mercy with trust.

EUCHARIST MIRACLE OF SIENA

In the Eucharistic Miracle of Siena, Italy in 1730 thieves were able to enter San Francesco's Church in Siena and steal the chalice containing 223 consecrated Hosts. After three days, on August 17th, the 223 consecrated Hosts were found intact. The Hosts were immediately taken back to the church of San Francesco in a solemn

procession. With the passing of time the Hosts did not change in appearance.

In 1914, Pope St. Pius X authorized a test. The edited report of the test stated: "The Sacred Hosts of Siena are the classic example of the **perfect conservation of particles from unleavened bread**, consecrated in the year 1730, and constitute a unique and most interesting phenomenon which **reverses the natural laws of conservation of organic matter**... It is strange, surprising, abnormal... the laws of nature have been reversed.

Pope John Paul II, during a visit in the city of Siena on September 14, 1980, said regarding the Hosts: **"It is the Real Presence!"**

The permanent miracle of the Sacred Hosts is available to see even today.


