

Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Gerard Chiusano sums up today's readings as **"Warning Sunday."** Jeremiah begins with "Cursed is the one..." and St. Luke ends with "Woe to you..." Is God trying to frighten us? God is making a contrast between the one who relies on human frailty and the one who relies on the Lord. When we



trust only in humans we are doomed to fail, but when we trust in God we bloom "like tree planted near running water," Jeremiah.

St. Luke's Beatitudes are in **stark contrast** to St. Matthew's, the most striking comes at the end, when Jesus adds admonitions to those who find their comforts among things of earth: Woe to you who are rich...Woe to you who laugh now...Woe to you when all speak well of you...

Luke, the physician, exhibited great concern for the poor. It may be for this reason that he added the admonitions.

These books are intended to be a **companion for people to use during Lent**. The books reflect on **Christ's life** based on the Passion narrative in the Gospel of John.

The idea and design for the book is like a "vademecum", which is Latin for **"travel with me."** The original concept for the small book was to be a constant companion for traveling priest that included rituals and prayers in a condensed book form.

This Little Black is **designed to have two pages for every day.** The right-hand side includes **scripture**, **explanations and reflections.** The Left-hand side has a variety of **quotes**, **information and timely thoughts**, many which are centered around the virtue of hope.

The Little Book **starts March 2nd** (three days before Ash Wednesday to prepare) through Easter Sunday, **April 20th.**
