Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles

The joint celebration of these two iconic apostles is important as a **symbol of Church unity.** As recorded in the Book of Acts and expressed in the letters of both Paul and Peter, the early Church was growing dramatically. It was **Paul of Tarsus who added a new dynamic** to the mission of the Church by bringing the Good News to the Gentiles.

Christianity was first seen as branch of Jewish faith. Jesus was the fulfillment of the law and the prophets. Peter and most of the twelve apostles saw this connection to Judaism as essential to the message of Jesus. Paul had a vision for Christianity that transcended its Jewish roots and appealed to the Gentiles. In large part because of Paul's charismatic personality and preaching, Christianity gained a substantial foothold.


ON THE LIGHTER SIDE
