






Eucharistic Miracle of Onil

In the Eucharistic miracle of Onil, Spain in 1824 a pyx containing a consecrated Host was robbed from a parish church.



Days later, a woman from the nearby town of Tibi recovered the stolen pyx with the consecrated Host inside in the middle of a green field. Exactly 119 years later, on November 28, 1943, Don Guillermo Hijarrubia, delegate of the Archbishop of Valencia, confirmed the authenticity of the miracle, verifying the complete

preservation of the Host, reinforcing the promise "I am with you always."

Our Lady of Zeitoun

May-The Month of Mary

In 2010, I went on a *Pilgrimage to Egypt and Israel*. In Cairo, we went to Virgin Mary Coptic Orthodox Church in Zeitoun. *Our Lady appeared* over the domes of this church to *millions* for more than a year, starting on Tuesday, April 2, 1968.

The apparitions lasted from only a few minutes up to several hours and were sometimes accompanied by luminous heavenly bodies shaped like doves and moving at high speeds. The

apparitions were seen by millions of Egyptians and foreigners. Among the witnesses were **Orthodox**, **Catholics**, **Protestants**, **Moslems**, **Jews and non-religious people** from all walks of life. The **sick were cured and blind persons received their sight**, **but most importantly large numbers of unbelievers were converted...**

On the evening of Sunday, April 28, 1968, an envoy from the Vatican arrived, saw the apparitions and sent a report to His Holiness Pope Paul VI of Rome.
