

The Third Sunday of Lent

The point of the episode in the First Reading, is not only that God can perform a miracle and bring water out of a rock, but also that the Israelites had ceased to trust God in the waterless desert. The place is called **Massah** which means “a test” or a “trial.” They failed the trial, but God did not.

In the Gospel reading with Jesus at the well, there is no physical miracle, but a greater spiritual miracle, when the men of Samaria say to the woman, “We know that this is truly the savior of the world.”

Did you notice that **the woman left her water jar**? If you didn't have a jar or a bucket to draw water from the well, and didn't get water, you died. She completely forgot her jar and left it at the well. Jesus had taught her the lesson that the spiritual water that he gives is more important than the physical water that Jacob's well gave, just as the soul is more important than the body.

Physical water, the second thing God created after light, and **spiritual water** called “grace,” are real. So real that **both are matters of life and death.**


